# Get Ready - Here are your Next Steps.

### **Admission Deposit**

Please ensure that you have paid your <u>admission deposit</u> by the date outlined in your SGS Offer Letter. Deposits can only be paid via credit card on <u>ACORN</u>. You need your JOINid to log into ACORN. If you are not sure what your JOINid is please email <u>mpp.admissions@utoronto.ca</u>. Please note it may take up 3 to 5 business days for the deposit to show up as a credit to your student account. The deposit will automatically go towards your tuition later this summer.

### **Official Transcripts**

Before starting the program in September you must submit an official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended. **Transcripts must be sent from the institution to us.** We prefer e-transcripts (sent to <a href="mailto:mpp.admissions@utoronto.ca">mpp.admissions@utoronto.ca</a>) if the institution offers this option as the Munk School is currently closed. ## Study Permit/Co-op Work Permit

International students should apply for a study permit/co-op work permit as soon as possible. When applying for a study permit, you have the option of also applying for a co-op work permit which will be needed for your summer internship. ### **Tuition Fees**

Tuition fees will be charged to your ACORN student account mid-July. The minimum amount to register (typically half your tuition) is due by the end of August. You will be able to see your fees invoice on <u>ACORN</u> once they are charged.

#### TCard/UTORid

A TCard is your student photo ID. Your UTORid is your official University of Toronto log in (currently your JOINid) which you will use to access your utoronot.ca email and course materials on <u>Quercus</u>. *In order to participate in the Microeconomics and MatStats prep courses, it is imperative that students have their UToronto email addresses and UTor IDs set up.* 

Beginning **June 1, 2021**, you will be able to get your TCard/UTORid and utoronto.ca email through the TCard Office. Virtual appointments are available for students who are unable to go to the office in person. Please consult the TCard Office <u>website</u> fore more information.

## Math-Stats Boot Camp & Micro Prep Course

The Math-Stats Boot Camp will be offered entirely online over the summer. It will start on Monday August 23 – Friday, September 10.

There will also be a Micro Prep Course, early-mid Aug (dates TBA).

The MathStats Prep course provides a review of many of the mathematical tools required for the first-year courses in quantitative methods and economics. At the end of the Prep course, there will be a diagnostic of the topics covered. While this diagnostic is mandatory of incoming MPP1 students, there is no "minimum mark" that must be achieved on it. Rather, the purpose of the diagnostic is to provide incoming MPP students with information regarding their readiness for the topics to be covered in our quantitative methods and economics courses.
